Orange Shirt Day originated in Canada to honor the survivors of residential schools and to raise awareness about the tragic legacy of these institutions. It was created by Phyllis Webstad, a member of the Stswecem'c Xgat'tem First Nation, whose orange shirt was taken away on her first day at a residential school in 1973. Webstad's story, along with other survivors' experiences, led to the establishment of this day as a national event on September 30th.
